

## What should these colors mean to us?

These are the colors of the Homeland Security Advisory System (HSAS) -- established to provide a comprehensive and effective means to disseminate information regarding the risk of terrorist attacks to all levels of government... and to "we, the people of the United States of America". Each color corresponds to a level of risk and associated protective measures, however they are primarily Agency related. In an effort to 'bring these colors home', NSDI offers some general suggestions as to our levels of vigilance, preparedness and readiness in the face of these threat conditions.
